DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. Share with the group: If you had to delete all but 3 apps from your smartphone, which ones would you keep?
- 2. Share with the group: What is something that God taught you, or is teaching you, during your personal Bible reading time?
- 3. What was your main take-away from Pastor Chuck's message this week?
- 4. Read Deuteronomy 5:1-21 and recall God's covenant. Now read Isaiah 1:1-15: What does this tell you about the spiritual condition of Israel during this time? Contrast the 2 passages and discuss what stood out the most.
- 5. Read Isaiah 1:16-20. Upon reading the passage above, what does this passage tell you about the heart of God but also the sovereignty of God?
- 6. Read Isaiah 1:21-31 What are people doing that angers God? What does God say He will do regarding this?
- 7. Isaiah Chapter 2 talks about the judgement that God will bring. Read Isaiah 2:6-21. Why will Jesus bring judgment? What were the people practicing?
- 8. Read Isaiah 5:1-7 and note what Isaiah says about God's vineyard. Now read John 15:1-8. Now compare/contrast the 2 parables. How do both passages give you a better understanding of God?

- 9. Read Isaiah 5:20-21. God warned us of a time when people will call evil good, and good evil... Discuss how we see this passage play out in today's time. How can we combat this with the truth of God's Word?
- 10. Read Isaiah 6:5-9. Note how after the live coal touched Isaiah's lips. What happens?
